



AP International Diploma (APID)

APID Criteria

Students must earn **scores of 3 or higher on five or more total AP Exams**, based on the exam criteria requirements listed within each of the content areas below.

Exams taken multiple times will only count once; the highest score will be used for award calculation.

Each AP Exam may count towards only one content area below.

CACULUS AB/BC and COMPUTER SCIENCE are calculating only once in APID criteria

Changes

* A student may submit a letter from an administrator at his or her school verifying the student's mastery of a language not currently available within the AP suite of exams. This verification, printed on school letterhead, will satisfy the requirement for ONE AP Exam in the language category. However, a student who utilizes this option must submit an additional AP Exam from another content area. Thus all students, however they satisfy the two-exam English and/or world language requirement, must submit a total of five AP Exam scores of 3 or higher to qualify for the APID.

****AP French Literature is no longer offered** by the AP Program, but students who have taken the AP French Literature Exam in the past and received an AP Exam score of 3 or higher may use this AP Exam to fulfill the APID world languages and cultures requirement.

*****AP Latin Literature and AP Latin: Vergil are no longer offered** by the AP Program, but students who have taken these exams in the past and received an AP Exam score of 3 or higher may use these AP Exams towards the APID exam criteria requirements.

To qualify for the APID, students must earn AP grades of 3 or higher on four AP exams in three of the five subject areas listed below. Students must take a total of two exams in two different languages (Subject Area I), either a Science or Mathematics exam (Subject areas II & III), and one or more exams from any subject area not already used.

Subject Area I:	Languages
Subject Area II:	Mathematics
Subject Area III:	History & Social Sciences
Subject Area IV:	Sciences
Subject Area V:	Electives
